ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Bylaws, Article III, Section 1.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's (Andrew Thompson) place of residence during the Revolution was Virginia

My ancestor, Andrew Thompson, assisted in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution as follows:

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Andrew Thompson came to Wilkes Co. just after the Revolution. He lived afterwards in Oglethorpe Co.--formerly a part of Wilkes-- in what was known as "the Wolfskin section."

He returned to Va. and lived several years finally coming back to Ga. where he died at the home of his son Samuel Thompson, who was a merchant at Wolfskin.

A certified copy of letter from him and his wife Elizabeth, to their son Samuel in Oglethorpe Co., Ga. is attached to No. 309105.

Elizabeth, daughter of Andrew Thompson, married Nathan Winfield in Oglethorpe about 1796. He drew land for Revolutionary services in a Land Lottery in Georgia. Only soldiers of the Georgia line or those in Continental service who assisted in Georgia's defense drew "on bounty."
